Free **downloaded** audio says each phrase twice (3 times if you choose English-English). No pauses, so you speak along with it.

Pronunciator.com

App: "Pronunciator" needs constant data connection

Only available if your library pays for it (including state-wide in Texas, North Carolina, Louisiana, and Arkansas). Search online for Pronunciator and the library name.

Explanations in 50 languages: Arabic, Chinese, Spanish, Vietnamese, etc. Intermediate learners can use English-UK with English-US, for more practice.

In each lesson (drop-down menus) you have to learn words in order. Click to repeat as often as you need.

"Main course" has **Core Vocabulary** (100 categories like computers), Powerful Phrases (50 **travel** categories like money), **100 Verbs** conjugated. Some languages have **Songs** (ProRadio) with lyrics, **Videos** with subtitles let you loop any phrase you want to learn, and **audio downloads**. (English has songs and videos, not downloads.)

Citizenship prep, **health** vocabulary, and grammar are in the first menu (same page as language selection in the App). It **listens and scores pronunciation**, under *Main Course / Drills / Pronunciation Analysis*, and you can **record and compare** your voice to teachers.

Explanations in 36 languages: Arabic, Chinese, Spanish, Thai, etc.

Click to play and repeat words *in any order* as often as you need; many words but no phrases. Good vocabulary practice if you have an unlimited data connection or wifi.

\$20 to **download** audio file, or listen to it free online. Limited use, since it says each phrase once in Spanish (or other language), once in English with pause to repeat, but hard to learn without immediate repetition in English, which you get online or in App, but not in download.
